



This summer, inspired by the Barrington Food Pantry's call for fresh fruit, we will be exploring the Fruits of the Spirit in a sermon series called "A Fruitful Summer." We will look at each fruit individually, and explore how to cultivate them in our lives. In order make these concepts more tangible, I am adding actions to each of the fruits to make them more engaging.

There are nine Sundays in July and August and nine Fruits of the Spirit, so the themes will be as follows:

July 2nd: Acting in Love with Strawberries

July 9th: Cultivating **Joy** with *Oranges*

July 16th: Working for Peace with Blueberries

July 23rd: Practicing Patience with Coconuts

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July 30th: Finding **Kindness** with *Apples*

August 6th: Teaching **Goodness** with *Grapes*

August 13th: Fortifying **Faithfulness** with *Figs*

August 20th: Showing Gentleness with *Peaches*

August 27th: Building **Self-Control** with *Pomegranates*

The health of fruit begins at the core of the plant. In order for us to bear good fruit, we must be in a healthy relationship with the root, which is God, and with the vine, which is Jesus. If our relationship is solid and nourishing, the fruit will be filled with integrity and compassion. If our relationship with God is strained, full of resentment, or ignored, our fruit will be rotten, that is ingenuine, self-serving, and pious.





Missions Committee Meeting April 20, 2023 (First-quarter 2023 Distributions)

The Missions Committee met on April 20, 2023. Those present were: Christy Davis, Carolyn Roussel, Glee Huddlestun, Sandy Schroeder (via phone) and Lauren Davis (via phone); absent – James Majzan, Jackie Phinney and Pastor Chris Shade

The congregation is encouraged to check out the **bulletin board** (created by Lauren and Christy Davis) in the narthex, which displays numerous thank you notes and letters from recipients of our benevolence donations. The communications reflect how CCB is making an impact in their respective missions.

Yellow cards ("Recommendations to the Missions Committee") have been placed in the pews to encourage congregants to provide suggestions of charities to be considered as recipients of our quarterly benevolence funds. The Committee is always appreciative of the congregation's input and seeks to consider new organizations as recipients of our benevolence funds.

UPDATE, Barrington Food Pantry: Grant awards have been received, with remodeling of the existing Pantry space taking place during May. The Food Pantry also has a new contract with Smart Farms for produce, which will impact our summer fresh produce donations. The Pantry is requesting that **only** fresh fruit donations be made June through September. We will call this the "fruitful/fruit-filled summer."

CCB will again be collecting girls' tops for **Barrington's Back-to-School Giving Day** (August) – Carol Marsh, coordinator. Information on sizes and dates will be updated as the summer moves along.

CCB maintains an **Assistance Fund** (formerly the Deacons' Fund), which offers financial help to those who have immediate need in the congregation and surrounding community. Requests for under \$200 are reviewed by the pastor and approved at his discretion. Requests over \$200 require approval of the Missions Committee. All payments issued are made directly to the source and not to the recipient individually. The Assistance Fund is funded by designated donations and no funds are taken from pledges or general income. Please consider a contribution to the Assistance Fund so that those facing financial need can turn to CCB for help and support in difficult circumstances. (Pew envelopes are available for your convenience.)

It was noted that the Samaritan Counseling Center is closing its doors, effective May 31, 2023, due to changes in the mental healthcare industry post-COVID.

Arrangements are pending for CCB's participation in an evening event with Feed My Starving Children.

First-quarter benevolence funds in the total amount of \$---4,490.17 were available for distribution, of which \$4,400 was disbursed to the following charities:

Neurobalance is located in Barrington and assists individuals who are faced with physical challenges. Its mission is to assist anyone living with a chronic condition reach their potential and maximize quality of life. It offers individuals assistance with mobility, balance, strength, coordination and speech, through one-on-one or group sessions. Prior donations were made in 2017 (\$1,000) and 2021 (\$1,000).

JourneyCare – **Barrington** provides hospice and palliative care. A prior donation of \$1,500 was made in 2016.

International Justice Mission seeks to free children and adults caught in human trafficking and suffering other injustices, including abuse and poverty from violence and slavery. It collaborates with local governments and community leaders to respond to violence, serve survivors and deter criminal behavior.

Kids Above All – Chicago, serves the counties of Cook, Lake, DuPage and Kane. It focuses solely on children offering early childhood learning programs, safe supportive housing services, and trauma counselling following abuse, neglect, poverty, violence or other injustices.

Outdoor Ministry of ABC Metro (which provides summer camp opportunities) is not funded through CCB's quarterly distribution to ABC Metro. This quarter, Missions chose to make a \$500 donation specifically to this entity of ABC Metro.
